Set of acrylics; basic colors/ burnt sienna ,red, yellow, blue, white, black, yellow ochre  
Set of brushes; *0,2,6,flat 1"*  
Small jar for water ( mustard or baby food jars are ideal)  
Canvas boards *or*  
Stretched Canvas minimum size 9x12  
barnwood or some surface other than paper or canvass, it can be cardboard  
paint rags  
palette, can be an old cookie sheet  
pencil  
charcoal  
tackle box to carry supplies
