Course Objectives/Competencies:

1. Build a working vocabulary of computer terminology
2. Be able to identify and explain the basic types of PC hardware
3. Be able to describe the function of word processing, spreadsheet, and presentation graphics software
4. Be able to list the hardware needed for an entry-level small office or home computer
5. Be able to utilize the Internet to do simple research
6. Be able to do simple file management such as to create folders, rename files, move files, copy files, and delete files
7. Be able to work with E-mail
8. Be able to create simple documents in MS Word, Excel, Access, and PowerPoint

You are expected to attend class. If you do not attend class on a regular basis you may be administratively dropped. Grading Criteria/Tests/Projects:

There will be three quizzes, exercises, and a final exam. Quizzes will be scheduled at least a week in advance. If you miss a scheduled quiz, be ready to take the make-up upon your first return to class unless you have made other arrangements. Without prior arrangements, make-up quizzes are short answer instead of multiple choice. If you know you cannot take a quiz at the scheduled time, let your instructor know in advance. The final will be comprehensive. Exercises will be given a score and a due date. You will not receive the maximum score if your work is turned in after the due date. Exercises more than three class meetings overdue will not be accepted. No work will be accepted after the end of summer semester.

At the end of the semester, the three quiz scores, the final and the exercise grade will be averaged. Each counts equally toward your grade. The grading scale below will determine your final grade. If your final average at the end of the semester is between grades, such as 84.3, then your attendance will determine whether you get the higher grade. If you have three absences or less, you get the higher grade. If you have over three absences for any reason, your grade remains the same.
