Papers are to be at least 5 pages APA style. A manual to explain APA style is available in the bookstore for those who need it as a reference. Double spaced. 12 Font. Papers and presentation will be on an area of interest from the student, related to one of the 3 main areas of criminal justice. (Policing, Corrections, or the Court System)
(Explanation of papers in class.)
