Scholarship Deadline:
July 1, 2010

This scholarship was started by the Foundation of Mayland Community College for the purpose of increasing student scholarship opportunities at Mayland Community College. This scholarship is funded primarily through student donations from various fundraising events such as a college coin drive, the SGA annual pool tournament, Mayland's Perfect Christmas Tree Contest and activity booths at Spring Fling.

Scholarship Criteria:

- Student must be attending a minimum of six credit hours
- Student must be seeking to complete a two-year degree or diploma program
- Student must have completed at least one semester at Mayland
- Student must be enrolled in field of study or transfer courses (not doing pre-major work)
- Student must have a minimum 2.0 GPA

How to Apply:

- See Scholarship Coordinator in Room P112 for application or pick one up from the rack just inside the middle entrance of the Phillips Building.
- Independently answer the four questions on application with each answer being 200 words or less (words will be counted)
- Type answers
- Proofread answers for grammar and typographical errors before submitting
- Be sure to have fun answering the questions – creative, out of the box, off the wall answers are key!!!
- Submit application along with LEO copy of your transcript
