

I. Academic Warning

- A. A student whose cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) falls below 2.00 or withdraws from all courses will be placed on Academic Warning until a cumulative 2.00 GPA is achieved. A student on Academic Warning:
1. is required to complete an Academic Action Plan with the student's assigned Student Success Advisor before being allowed to take classes the next semester;
 2. is encouraged to limit enrollment to 15 or fewer semester hours; and
 3. will be placed on Academic Probation if he/she fails to achieve a 2.00 GPA for the semester or withdraws from all courses.

II. Academic Probation

- A. A student on Academic Warning who fails to achieve a 2.00 GPA for the semester or withdraws from all courses will be placed on Academic Probation. Academic Probation is a one semester classification. A student on Academic Probation:
1. is required to complete an Academic Action Plan with the student's assigned Student Success Advisor before being allowed to take classes the next semester;
 2. is required to limit enrollment to 13 or fewer semester hours;
 3. cannot pre-register until the second week of Priority Registration;
 4. will be removed from Academic Probation after one semester if he/she achieves a 2.00 GPA for the semester and will remain on Academic Warning until a cumulative 2.00 GPA is achieved; and
 5. will be placed on Academic Suspension if he/she fails to achieve a 2.00 GPA for the semester or withdraws from all courses.

III. Academic Suspension

A student on Academic Probation who fails to achieve a 2.00 GPA for the semester or withdraws from all courses will be placed on Academic Suspension. A student on Academic Suspension is required to withdraw from Mayland Community College for at least one semester. After the semester of suspension, a student will be allowed to petition for readmission. The petition must be in writing, prepared by the student, and include a justification for readmission. Readmission must be approved by the Dean of Students. Upon re-enrollment, the student will be placed on Academic Probation and subject to the restrictions and requirements of this academic standing. A second suspension will result in two required semesters of withdrawal. A third suspension will result in more severe consequences that the Vice-President deems appropriate.

IV. A student on Academic Warning, Probation, or Suspension will be notified of academic standing by an e-mail and/or letter from the Dean of Students. The letter will explain the steps described above.

V. A student on Academic Warning, Probation, or Suspension is not considered to be in good academic standing with the College. A 2.0 cumulative GPA is required for good academic standing.

VI. A student who wishes to dispute an Academic Suspension must, within ten (10) working days of the academic decision being made, file an appeal, in writing, to the Dean of Students.
