

Mayland Promise Applied Engineering Associate Degree

The Mayland Promise for the Applied Engineering Associate Degree is available to High School Graduates who have successfully completed 16 credit hours of College and Career Promise Program (CCP). The Mayland Promise will cover tuition and fees for the remainder (up to two years) of the Associate Degree in the Applied Engineering program with Mayland Community College (MCC).

Eligibility Requirements

1. Be a resident of Mitchell, Avery, or Yancey County.
2. Be a high school graduate (public or private) or registered home-school equivalent and plan to attend MCC as a degree-seeking student in Applied Engineering the fall semester immediately following his or her high school graduation.
3. Successfully complete at least 16 hours of dual-enrollment courses through the Career and College Promise program at MCC with a GPA of 2.0 or higher and a 67% completion rate by the time of high school graduation.

Enrollment Requirements

1. Apply to Mayland as a degree-seeking student in Applied Engineering by completing the online admissions application at mayland.edu
 - More than likely, you have already completed a MCC admissions application for the Career and College Promise Program (CCP) in high school, but a new admissions application is required when you become a college student.
 - After you submit your new MCC admissions application, you will receive an acceptance letter and email correspondence with more details about next steps

Apply for financial aid by completing the 2019-20 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) using **2017** tax information at fafsa.gov.

Deadline Information

Fall 2019 Mayland Promise Deadline: July 15, 2019

The following requirements must be met by July 15, 2019 in order to participate in the Promise program.

- Your new MCC admissions application for Applied Engineering must be completed, submitted, and on record with the MCC Office of Records and Retention.
- Your official high school transcript showing your graduation date must be submitted and on record with the MCC Admissions Office.
- Your MCC Promise Scholarship Application must be completed, submitted, and on record with the MCC Scholarship Office.
- Your 2019-20 FAFSA and all additional, required financial aid paperwork must be completed, submitted, and on record with the MCC Financial Aid Office. If you wait until the week of the deadline to complete and submit your FAFSA to MCC, you will not meet the deadline. FAFSA forms may take up to five days or longer to process first with the Department of Education, and then you may have to complete required financial aid paperwork with the MCC Financial Aid Office, which may take up to a month if Federal income tax transcripts are required.

Applicants who submit a new MCC admissions application, an official high school transcript, an MCC scholarship application, a 2019-20 FAFSA, and/or required financial aid paperwork after July 15, 2019 will not be accepted into the Promise program.

Scholarship Details

For students who meet all of the required criteria, Mayland Community College will agree to pay the tuition and technology, administration, activity, student insurance, and parking fees up to the in-state rate for two years, including summer terms for the Applied Engineering Associate Degree.

- MCC will cover tuition up to the in-state rate for courses taken by out of state students. If an out of state student receives other forms of financial aid that cover the in-state tuition portion, the student will not be eligible for the Mayland Promise Program.
- The two years of eligibility begins in the fall semester after high school graduation and ends following the summer semester of the second year.
- Student must be categorized as full time to maintain the scholarship.
- Funding from federal and state grants, scholarships, and outside funding must be exhausted before the MCC Promise begins paying.
- Books and additional class supplies are not included under the Mayland Promise Program.

Post-Enrollment Requirement

- Once enrolled, students must continuously meet the financial aid Satisfactory Academic Progress standards outlined by the state and federal government (maintain at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA and complete at least 67% of all courses attempted at Mayland Community College).
- Enrolling in fewer hours recommended or altering the academic plan suggested by the student's advisor could impact degree completion.
